[Disaster Countermeasures]

- ✓ Strengthen disaster countermeasures in the community such as emergency training
- ✓ Promote emergency measures in the event of an eruption at Mt. Fuji
- ✓ Provide a Yamanashi's original support and relief for victims affected by a disaster
